



ROHS Compliance Declaration

The Restriction of Hazardous Substances Directive 2002/95/EC, (RoHS 1), short for Directive on the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment, was adopted in February 2003 by the European Union. The RoHS 2 directive (2011/65/EU) is an evolution of the original directive and became law on 21 July 2011 and took effect January 2nd 2013. It addresses the same substances as the original directive while improving regulatory conditions and legal clarity. It requires periodic reevaluations that facilitate gradual broadening of its requirements to cover additional electronic and electrical equipment, cables and spare parts. The directive restricts the use of the following substances in electronic components:

1. Lead (Pb)
2. Mercury (Hg)
3. Cadmium (Cd)
4. Hexavalent chromium (Cr6+)
5. Polybrominated biphenyls (PBB)
6. Polybrominated diphenyl ether (PBDE)

Additional Restricted Substances (EU) 2015/863 adds four additional substances:

1. Bis(2-Ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP)
2. Benzyl butyl phthalate (BBP)
3. Dibutyl phthalate (DBP)
4. Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP)



ProMed's Position on ROHS and (EU) 2015/863:

ProMed does not have or manufacture its own products. ProMed manufactures molded silicone components, many with metallic inserts and wire leads, per designs provided by its customers on contract basis. It is ProMed's position that its customers define and own their product design, Bill of Material (BOM), and it's associated Approved Manufacturer's List (AML). And to that end, ProMed feels its customers have total ownership and responsibility for identifying and specifying the components on their BOM to meet compliance requirements by European Union or other regulatory agencies.

It is ProMed's policy to build customer products in full compliance with customer's design and Bill of Material. ProMed does not and will not deviate from Customer's Bill of Material unless it has full approval and consent from its customers.
